Board of Directors Motions

March 13, 2017

It was moved by Michon, second by Todd, to combine the Education Committee into the Membership Committee and transfer the budgeted funds for the Education Committee to the Membership Committee for educational purposes. The motion carried unanimously.

Membership Committee recommendation for Sportsman of the Year is Michon Mills. Todd, David, Gail and Don vote yes, Michon abstain

Via Facebook, it was moved by Allison, second by Gail to dissolve the FCI Committee since USMRA was granted a 5-year variance. The motion carried unanimously.

Via Facebook, it was moved by Michon, second by David to rescind the prior Board motion on January 16, 2017 and allow all purebred dogs to place on the podium at all levels.

Via Facebook, it was moved by Gail, second by Michon that the criteria for choosing the World Team be amended to clarify selection in the case of a non FCI recognized dog becomes National Champion. Motion carried unanimously

Via Facebook, it was moved by Gail, second by Paul to recognize the Level 3 team with the highest score be declared the National Champion, regardless of FCI recognized status. All teams competing in the Championship will be allowed to place on the podium, ranked by score, regardless of FCI registration requirements. A non-FCI recognized dog will not be permitted to compete at the FCI World Championship per FCI rules. Motion carried by Majority. Yes – Gail, Paul, Michon, Todd, Allison No David

Via Facebook, it was moved by Michon, second by Allison, to rescind the two prior motions moved by Gail, about allowing non-FCI dogs to win and the motion to clarify the World Team Criteria, due to USMRA being granted a variance that allows non-FCI recognized dogs to compete. The motion carried unanimously.

Due to the variance, all dogs will be able to compete and place determined by highest score.

Via Facebook, it was moved by Michon, second by Allison, to allow the member involved in this incident, to renew her USMRA membership and submit for a scorebook replacement for her dog. The motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Gail, second by Michon, “beginning July 16, 2017, all dogs competing in USMRA events will be required to have either a tattoo or microchip for identification purposes. All clubs hosting trials will be required to verify the identification of each dog competing in USMRA trials prior to the beginning of the trial. Dogs without verified identification will not be allowed to participate in USMRA trials after July 16, 2017. The motion carried unanimously.
