Note to the USMRA

Dear President,

Your request dated 02202017 to obtain a temporary exemption of a part of the international FCI rules for Mondioring that determines: The dog must have a pedigree recognized by the F.C.I. (International Cynological Federation)

After consultation between the President of the FCI utility commission and the SMUCDFCI, I can inform you:

- Taking in consideration and note that the efforts made by the USMRA in the USA in order to promote the FCI Program Mondioring to make it successful;
- Taking into consideration that at present about 30 percent of the dog sporters in Mondioring in the USA are in possession of a pure breed dog without FCI recognized pedigree.
- In order not to bring in danger the further development and success of the FCI Program Mondioring in the USA :

The decision was taken, That for a period of 5 years, an exemption of the obligation to have an FCI recognized pedigree is allowed to the USMRA.

The other obligations such as mentioned in the International regulations shall continue to be applied. The FCI Mondioring judges are allowed to judge these dogs and to sign the results in the scorebook.

These dogs can under no circumstances take part at Mondioring competitions in FCI countries nor be selected for participation at international trials and the FCI World Championship for Mondioring.

This exemption of the international FCI Mondioring regulations ends on 31.12.2021. Starting 01.01.2022 all dogs that participate in the USA at trials under the international FCI Mondioring must have an FCI recognized pedigree.

Mr. President we request a return of these letter signed for acceptance to the Secretariat SMUCDFCI.
